I. Introduction

- A. The Church of the Brethren, Mennonites, Durkards, some Church of God, some United Methodists, some Seventh Day Adventist, some Episcopals, and some Catholics (Maundy Thursday—before Easter)...practice "Foot Washing" claiming John 13 commands it. In fact, many believe it is a church ordinance. Some practice Foot Washing with Communion, some pastors/priests wash parishioners' feet, others pair up and wash each other's feet...
- B. Quotes:
 - 1. "I believe that the Bible shows ample proof for 3 ordinances of Gods Church. These are Baptism, Communion and Foot washing." (Pastor Anthony T. Molihan, Stanton First Church of God)
 - 2. "Feet-washing as an ordinance is not generally observed by professing Christians; in fact, by many the doctrine is spurned, misrepresented, and ridiculed as is no other teaching of Christ recorded in the gospel history. Notwithstanding the fact that Christ said we "should" do it, that we "ought to wash one another's feet," they never observe it, either as a public ordinance or as a private duty." (F.G. Smith)
