- C. <u>Rom. 6:23</u>—"For the wages of sin is death; but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord."
- D. <u>1Pe. 3:18</u>—"For Christ also hath once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, <u>that He</u> might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh, but quickened by the Spirit:"
- E. <u>Rom. 5:8</u>—"But <u>God commendeth His love towards us</u>, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us."
- F. <u>John 3:16</u>—"For <u>God so loved the world</u>, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him, should not perish, but have everlasting life."
- G. <u>Heb. 2:9</u>—"But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death, crowned with glory and honor; that He by the grace of God should taste death for every man."
- H. <u>Heb. 9:22-26</u>—"And almost all things are by the law purged with blood; and without shedding of blood is no remission. <u>It was</u> therefore <u>necessary that</u> the patterns of things in <u>the heavens should be purified</u> with these; but the heavenly things themselves with better sacrifices than these. For <u>Christ</u> is not <u>entered</u> into the holy places made with hands, which are the figures of the true; but <u>into heaven itself</u>, now <u>to appear in the presence of God for us</u>: Nor yet that He should offer Himself often, as the high priest entereth into the holy place every year with blood of others; For then must He often have suffered since the foundation of the world: but <u>now once</u> in the end of the world hath <u>He appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of Himself</u>."

I. <u>Heb 10:10-14</u>—"By the which will <u>we are sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all</u>. And every priest standeth daily ministering and offering oftentimes the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins: But this Man, after He had offered one sacrifice for sins forever, sat down on the right hand of God; From henceforth expecting till His enemies be made His footstool. For by one offering He hath perfected forever them that are sanctified."
