- h. Mat. 18:19—"Again I say unto you, That if two of you shall agree on earth as touching anything that they shall ask, it shall be done for them of My Father which is in heaven."
- i. Mat. 6:7—"But when ye pray, use not vain repetitions, as the heathen do: for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking."
- j. Luk. 18:9-14—"9-And He spake this parable unto certain which trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and despised others: 10-Two men went up into the temple to pray; the one a Pharisee, and the other a publican. 11-The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, God, I thank Thee, that I am not as other men are, extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this publican. 12-I fast twice in the week, I

- give tithes of all that I possess. 13-And the publican, standing afar off, would not lift up so much as his eyes unto heaven, but smote upon his breast, saying, God be merciful to me a sinner. 14-I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other: for every one that exalteth himself shall be abased; and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted."
- k. Mat. 6:6—"But you, when you pray, enter into your closet, and when you have shut your door, pray to your Father, which is in secret; and your Father, which sees in secret shall reward you openly."
- I. Mat. 26:41 (cf. Mar. 14:38; Luk. 22:40, 46)—"Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation: the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak."
- m. Luk. 10:2—"Therefore said He unto them, 'The harvest truly is great, but the laborers are few: pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that He would send forth laborers into His harvest."
- n. Rom. 8:26—"Likewise the Spirit also helps our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit Itself makes intercession for us with groanings, which cannot be uttered."
