- IV. Obstacles to Forgiveness How can we overcome the following?
 - A. Anger/Forgiveness has a Cause/Effect relationship (James 1:19-20—"19-Wherefore, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to hear, slow to speak, slow to wrath: 20-For the wrath of man worketh not the righteousness of God.").
 - 1. Why (expectations...)?
 - 2. What is really at stake (right / wrong, sin...)?
 - 3. What am I fighting for (bad day, pride, my rights)?
 - B. Pride (Pro. 13:10—"Only by pride cometh contention: but with the well advised is wisdom.").
 - C. Fear (1Jo. 4:18—"There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear: because fear hath torment. He that feareth is not made perfect in love.").
 - 1. But they may do it again...
 - 2. But they may not change...

V. Practical Applications

- A. **Forgive quickly** (So the less judgment will occur to us and the offender, the quicker we will be forgiven, the less pain and separation will be experienced, the less time wasted on nurturing destructive feelings, and the more time and emotional energy can be spent on resolving and dealing with the true problem).
- B. **Forgive first**, then deal work through the issues. If wrong or accused of being wrong, confess sin and do not be afraid to ask for forgiveness (1Jo. 1:9—"If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."). Your mate will not think worse of you, they will respect you more and will find it easier to ask for forgiveness when they have offended you.
- C. **Grow and nurture Godly character qualities** that are conducive to forgiveness (e.g., love, patience, humility...).
- D. **Men lead out in forgiveness** (Demonstrating love and forgiveness will create an environment where your whole family can be human and make mistakes and still feel unconditionally loved and accepted).

- E. **Let forgiveness become a pattern** in your life (By forgiving, you can develop a pattern of forgiveness).
- F. **Pray and trust God to give you strength** to forgive (For long term relationships to work and get better, you cannot hang on to past failures, there is more than enough evil for each day [*Mat. 6:34—"...Sufficient unto the day is the evil thereof."*]).

VI. Conclusion.

- A. Forgiveness is a command and it reveals your character.
- B. Forgiveness is faith that we have been forgiven so much more.
- C. Remember that God promises to Judge:
 - 1. The Wrong person (we do not want mate or person judged).
 - 2. The Right person who does not forgive (so becomes wrong).
 - 3. All those caught up in our sin (harboring anger, becoming bitter).
- D. Can you forgive yourself, why or why not?
- E. Let's be better, not bitter. What are the opposites of Anger, Pride, and Fear (which are all Fruit of the Flesh)?
- F. How can you get forgiveness closure on deep hurtful issues?
