Remarriage

- I. Introduction.
 - A. What are the 3 ideal conditions for any marriage?
 - 1. It is only to be with 1-Male and 1-Female (Gen. 2:18-25).
 - 2. Both are to be virgins (cf. Lev. 21:14).
 - 3. Both are to be Christians (1Co. 7:39; 2Co. 6:14-17).
 - B. What is the duration of Marriage?
 - C. How do you define remarriage?
 - D. Why is this such an important topic?
 - E. **My challenge to you.** Seek earnestly a view on remarriage that is most pleasing to God. Let Scripture determine your view. Do not find people who will justify what you want to be God's view/ideal. Pray earnestly God will give you wisdom on this very, very, difficult topic. Give mercy and grace to people with differing views.
- II. Scripture.
 - A. Deu. 24:1-4 "¹When a man hath taken a wife, and married her, and it come to pass that she find no favor in his eyes, because he hath found some uncleanness in her: then let him write her a bill of divorcement, and give it in her hand, and send her out of his house. ²And when she is departed out of his house, she may go and be another man's wife. ³And if the latter husband hate her, and write her a bill of divorcement, and giveth it in her hand, and sendeth her out of his house; or if the latter husband die, which took her to be his wife; ⁴Her former husband, which sent her away, may not take her again to be his wife, after that she is defiled; for that is abomination before the LORD: and thou shalt not cause the land to sin, which the LORD thy God giveth thee for an inheritance."
 - B. Rom. 7:1-3 "¹Know ye not, brethren, (for I speak to them that know the law,) how that the law hath dominion over a man as long as he liveth? ²For the woman which hath an husband is bound by the law to her husband so long as he liveth; but if the husband be dead, she is loosed from the law of her husband. ³So then if, while her husband liveth, she be married to another man, she shall be called an adulteress: but if her husband be dead, she is free from that law; so that

- she is no adulteress, though she be married to another man."
- C. 1Co. 7:39 "The wife is bound by the law as long as her husband liveth; but if her husband be dead, she is at liberty to be married to whom she will; only in the Lord."
- D. 1Co. 7:10-11 "10And unto the married I command, yet not I, but the Lord, 'Let not the wife depart from her husband: 11But and if she depart, let her remain unmarried, or be reconciled to her husband: and let not the husband put away his wife."
- E. Mar. 10:11-12 "11And he saith unto them, 'Whosoever shall put away his wife, and marry another, committeth adultery against her. 12And if a woman shall put away her husband, and be married to another, she committeth adultery."
- F. Luk. 16:18 "Whosoever putteth away his wife, and marrieth another, committeth adultery: and whosoever marrieth her that is put away from her husband committeth adultery."

III. Understanding.

- A. Key Views on Remarriage.
 - 1. **Permitted if "legally" divorced.** If legal in the government's or law's eyes, this view believe remarriage is always permitted, under any circumstance, as long as with just 1 person at a time.
 - Permitted if "spiritually" legally divorced. If they were the "innocent" party (no fornication) from a divorce in God's eyes. This view has some limited exceptions like some of the 5-Ds: 1) Dead-deeds (divorce before saved), 2) Desertion (innocent party deserted or divorced by spouse), 3) aDultery (some believe Christ's exception permitting divorce permits remarriage), 4) Divorced-spouse (spouse divorces you and you are innocent), or 5) Death (spouse dies so no longer bound).
 - Permitted if "divorced before became a Christian." If any deeds done before becoming a Christian are "Dead-deeds;" all has been forgiven, they are now a new creation—they cite 1Co. 5:17 "If any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new").

- 4. Permitted if an unbelieving spouse leaves, deserts, or divorces an "innocent" spouse. They cite 1Co. 7:12-15 "12But to the rest speak I, not the Lord: If any brother hath a wife that believeth not, and she be pleased to dwell with him, let him not put her away. 13And the woman which hath an husband that believeth not, and if he be pleased to dwell with her, let her not leave him. 14For the unbelieving husband is sanctified by the wife, and the unbelieving wife is sanctified by the husband: else were your children unclean; but now are they holy. 15But if the unbelieving depart, let him depart. A brother or a sister is not under bondage in such cases: but God hath called us to peace").
 - a. **All can divorce and remarry** (If 1) they were sexually innocent, and 2) their spouse divorced or disserted them).
 - b. All can divorce, but NOT remarry.
 - c. All can separate, but NOT divorce, and thus NOT remarry.
- 5. Permitted if spouse committed adultery on them and divorced them (and they were "innocent" spouse).
- 6. Permitted only if they remarry their divorced spouse if neither have been remarried to anyone else (*Deu. 24:1-4*; *1Co. 7:10-11*).
- 7. **Permitted if spouse died** (and neither were married to anyone else; a widow or widower; *Rom. 7:1-3*; *1Co. 7:39*; *Mat.* 22:23-28).
- 8. NOT permitted if ever divorced (Mar. 10:11-12; Luk. 16:18; 1Co. 7:10-11; Rom. 7:1-3; Mat. 5:31-32; 19:9-12; John Stott, Heth and Wenham, John Piper, Charles Ryrie, J. Vernon McGee).

IV. Application.

A. Which remarriage view do you believe God teaches?

#	Key Remarriage View
1	Always permitted if "legally" divorced (government legal).
2	Permitted if "spiritually" legally divorced (you are "innocent").
3	Permitted if "divorced before a Christian" (dead-deeds).
4	Permitted if "unbeliever deserts innocent" spouse (a. All, b.
	Divorce ok/no remarriage, c. separate/not divorce/no remarriage).
5	Permitted if "spouse committed adultery and divorced them"
	(and they were "innocent" party).
6	Permitted if "they only remarry their divorced spouse" (neither has been remarried to anyone else).
7	Permitted if "spouse died" (and neither were married to another).
8	Never permitted if divorced (except for views 6 or 7).

B. Guidance.

- 1. Everyone "be fully persuaded" in your own heart and mind (Rom. 14:5), and willing to help others on this sensitive issue.
- 2. If a person is remarried un-Biblically/wrongly, they should repent/confess (*1Jo. 1:9*), but remain married and committed to the new promise they made to their new spouse (cf. *1Co. 7:20*).
- 3. If a person has divorced or left you, but is not yet remarried, forgive, pray, wait, and hope that God will restore them to Him and you (cf. *Deu. 24:1-4*; *1Co. 7:10-11*). Also, live undistracted as a full follower of Jesus Christ.
- 4. Affair-proof your marriage.
- 5. Pray for your marriage and encourage others to remain faithful.
