- A. 3 John 1-14.
 - 1. 1:1—"The elder unto the well-beloved Gaius, whom I love in the truth."
 - 2. 1:2-4—"²Beloved, I wish above all things that thou mayest prosper and be in health, even as thy soul prospereth. ³For I rejoiced greatly, when the brethren came and testified of the truth that is in thee, even as thou walkest in the truth. ⁴I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth."
 - 3. 1:5-8—"⁵Beloved, thou doest faithfully whatsoever thou doest to the brethren, and to strangers; ⁶Which have borne witness of thy charity before the church: whom if thou bring forward on their journey after a godly sort, thou shalt do well: ⁷Because that for his name's sake they went forth, taking nothing of the Gentiles. ⁸We therefore ought to receive such, that we might be fellow-helpers to the truth."
 - 4. 1:9-10—"9I wrote unto the church: but Diotrephes, who love th to have the preeminence among them, receiveth us not. 10Wherefore, if I come, I will remember his deeds which he doeth, prating against us with malicious words: and not content therewith, neither doth he himself receive the brethren, and forbiddeth them that would, and casteth them out of the church."
 - 5. 1:1-12—"¹¹Beloved, follow not that which is evil, but that which is good. He that doeth good is of God: but he that doeth evil hath not seen God. ¹²Demetrius hath good report

of all men, and of the truth itself: yea, and we also bear record; and ye know that our record is true."

- 6. 1:13-14—"13I had many things to write, but I will not with ink and pen write unto thee: 14But I trust I shall shortly see thee, and we shall speak face to face. Peace be to thee. Our friends salute thee. Greet the friends by name."
- B. Loving, true, good, hospitable, and welcoming Gaius/Demetrius vs hating, fake, evil, and inhospitable/unwelcoming Diotrephes.
